Mount Prospect Public Library has no control over these sites/resources nor does the Library have complete knowledge of what is available on the internet. Patrons access the internet at their own risk. Mount Prospect Public Library supports the right of all library users to access information using the Library's public access computers.

Mount Prospect Public Library further makes no representations about the security of information transmitted or the suitability of any software or content or information made accessible by the software of this system. Information on the internet may be reliable, complete, and accurate or it may be inaccurate, incomplete, out-of-date, or unavailable at times.

By using the Library's public access computers, you agree that Mount Prospect Public Library shall not be liable for any damages suffered by the users of this system or the software, programming, and other documentation found on this system.

Library patrons are asked to consider the public space used by individuals of all ages, backgrounds, and sensibilities when accessing potentially controversial, offensive, or disturbing information and images. The Library reserves the right to require individuals to discontinue the display of information and images that disrupt the orderly operation of the Library.

## **MOUNT PROSPECT PUBLIC LIBRARY INTERNET SERVICE POLICY**

Mount Prospect Public Library requires that library patrons using the Library's public access computers and electronic information networks such as the internet do so within the guidelines of acceptable use. The following activities are unacceptable:

1. Use of electronic information networks for any purpose which results in the harassment of other users.
2. Destruction of, damage to, or unauthorized alteration of the Library's computer equipment, software, or network security procedures.
3. Conduct which violates Federal, State, or local law including copyright and licensing infringement.
4. Use of electronic information networks in any way which violates licensing and payment agreements between this Library and network/database providers.
5. Unauthorized duplication of copyright protected software or violation of software license agreements.
6. Violations of system security.
