Getting Books from the Library

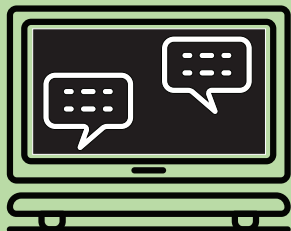
The Mount Prospect Public Library offers Book Bag checkouts for homeschool families. Materials are checked out on your library card. Homeschool families can pick up and drop off materials in the library or use the Parking Lot Pickup service.

Book Bag Service

- Loan period is three weeks. Renewals may be possible by notifying the library in advance of the due date. Items that have holds cannot be renewed.
- Book bags contain approximately 15-25 items. Some topics may be limited to 5-10 books when in high demand.
- Homeschoolers are limited to one Book Bag at a time.

- Please allow 72-hours notice for all book bag requests.
