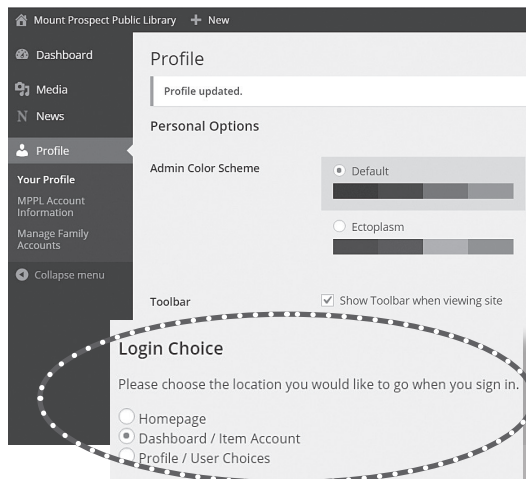
You can now choose the page you want to start on (default page) after logging into our site. Choose from:

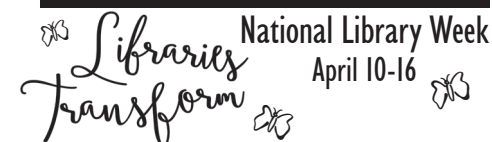


Trade Food for Fines!

Coin Collecting and Appraisals

Clean Energy, Clean Jobs

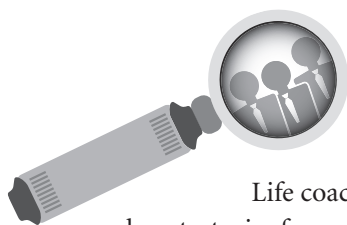
