

Prior to his time on the Board of Trustees, Zulaski was a regular library user and had been involved with the Coffee, Books, and More discussion group.

Always an advocate for the Library, Zulaski would occasionally give library tours. "One day I was giving a tour of our Library and showing off our 'take away' bags of toys, travel kits, etc.,

and the idea just clicked. What if our youngsters could take home a science kit?," Zulaski wrote for a library science resource blog in 2013.

Last year Zulaski, along with Head of Youth Services Mary Smith, were honored by the Institute of Electrical and Electronics Engineers-USA (IEEE-USA) with a K-12 STEM Literacy Committee Educator-Engineer Partnership Award for their work in creating the science kits.

A resident of Mount Prospect for more than 40 years, Zulaski also volunteered as part of an English as a Second Language program at Oakton Community College. He is also on the Mount Prospect Centennial Commission.
