and more with Zinio, a new online magazine service that brings a variety of popular magazines to your computer or mobile device for free.

Zinio, which is available on the Research/Web Resources page, requires patrons to establish two accounts. After you create a Library-specific account using your MPPL card number, Zinio will send you a confirmation e-mail. When you select your first magazine, you'll set up an account with Zinio and download the app for your iPad, Kindle Fire, Blackberry Playbook, or Android device.

Once logged in, you can download and read a magazine immediately or save it for later. Desktop and laptop users can read magazines directly in their browser at Zinio.com.

There are no due dates, holds, or borrowing limits. You can leave a copy of a magazine on your computer/ device as long as you'd like.

In purchasing Zinio, MPPL's staff considered how residents use the print magazine collection.
