Multilingual Patrons Benefit From Back to Books Grant

Mount Prospect Public Library was one of 100 Illinois libraries to receive a "Back to Books" grant from State Librarian Jesse White. MPPL received \$3,450 in grant money. These dollars help libraries acquire fiction and/or nonfiction books, learning CDs and DVDs, and other educational materials.

MPPL's project, "Reading, Listening, and Participating: Literacy and Enjoyment for Native Speakers," will allow us to purchase more materials in Spanish, Polish, Korean, and Gujarati.

"We are excited that the grant will help us serve our multilingual patrons better," said Library Development Manager Pam Nelson.

Not only will the grant make more materials available, but MPPL staff and patrons will go on to use them for book discussions and other programs.

"As circulation increases for foreign language materials, we are continually updating our World Languages collection," said South Branch Manager Maria Garstecki.

Awards are made possible by a combination of funds from the Federal Institute of Museum and Library Services and State of Illinois library funds.
