

The Prospect Madrigals Holiday Concert



MPPL FOUNDATION PRESENTS: Encore! Singers Holiday Concert







MPPL Purchases Painting From Much-loved Artist



Eleanor Bock always liked art, but it was her sister who had the talent and earned the art degree. Growing up, Bock would hold the family dog while her sister painted.

As an adult, she and her husband visited the Art Institute of Chicago regularly. She wanted to buy art for their home, but it was too expensive.

Later in life, Bock solved her own art problem—and found her own talent—when she began taking art lessons. MPPL patrons have found Bock's talent as well, as the Library owns six paintings by her, including her newest work *Near Northside of Chicago*.

The Buffalo Grove resident visited MPPL many times before the Library owned her work, but it was actually a staff member seeing Bock's paintings at a local art show that prompted the first purchase. Her watercolors depicting flowers and other natural beauties have thrilled patrons and staff for years.

While Bock has worked in many media, watercolor is a favorite.
"You can do so many things with it,"

she says. She is her own best critic, reviewing her own work for rhythm, depth, and harmony as well as color and composition.

Bock's ability to capture what can be so fleeting in real life has earned her a following in the suburbs. She tells the story of one of her shows at a local gallery. A customer recognized one of her paintings in the store's window. "That was a thrill to me!" she remembers.

MPPL's public art on permanent display, including Bock's paintings, is a community gallery. Public art has been made possible by donations from residents, community groups, the Foundation, and the Friends of the Library. The works reflect a variety of aesthetic expressions across a range of media.


