

Lighthouses of Michigan





Library Holds

Getting ready for summer? Whether planning a road trip or a staycation at home, add this quick reminder to your todo list: library holds.

Excited about a new book or a blockbuster movie? Be in the know and get in the queue. Use "My Account" online or the MPPL app to place a hold so you receive it when it returns to the library. This is one of the most popular ways patrons get in line to receive materials as soon as they are available.

However, this is not the only way to use the holds feature.

You can also suspend holds, so you do not "lose" your requested item or your place in line when out of town or when unable to visit the library for an extended period. You can also decide to cancel a hold request altogether.

View holds and your place in the queue anytime with the MPPL app or by accessing your account online.

Questions? Library staff are happy to help you place hold requests in-person, by phone, or help with the app.
