



Regular Library Board Meeting Thursdays, 7 p.m. March 18 and April 15



As of April 1, the Mount Prospect Public Library is officially a fine free library. The library wants everyone in the community to use to the library's resources, not worry about overdue fines when "life happens."

In June 2020, the Board of Trustees declared a Fine Amnesty Day and cleared patrons' accounts of fines, and we haven't assessed any fines since. Shifting focus to library access instead of penalties is great news for the community.

Patrons should still return materials by the due date, and we will help with reminders the first week when materials are overdue. When one or more items are 14 days overdue, patrons won't be able to check out any new materials. To unblock an account, simply return the items.

This policy only applies to overdue items, and we still assess fees to replace unreturned, lost, or damaged items.
