More than 80 registered for the adult program and 60 signed up at the South Branch.

Twenty-three teens registered at the Library, and 114 more signed up when a teen outreach librarian visited Lincoln Middle School.




### The Essential Houdini




# Shirley Temple: Sparkling Star (Part 2) Wednesday, August 31, 1 p.m.





# Local Sculptor's Talent Enriches Youth Area

### Park District Class Leads to Library Donation

Andrea Lenberg's artistic path started at one Mount Prospect organization and has now benefitted another. Lenberg recently donated her sculpture, "Cherished One," to the Library.

Lenberg took a pottery class at the Mt. Prospect Park District. She learned to slab, coil, and pinch the clay into the desired forms. Lenberg already knew she wanted to sculpt, so, with the help of the instructor, she adapted these techniques. She took inspiration from all around her—"Cherished One," depicting a tender moment between a mother and child, was inspired by an advertisement.

"I loved the intimacy and the life," of the pose, she said.

"Cherished One" is made of bronze, through a process that involved creating the sculpture in clay and then lost-waxcasting in bronze.

She's still sculpting, but Lenberg has also moved into fused glass and reports that all of her friends now have many pendant necklaces. She's also sold her work at art fairs and galleries.

This 45-year resident of Mount Prospect appreciates that her art can help out another group that has been dear to her. Her daughter is a resident at a Palatine group home run by St. Coletta of Wisconsin and
