
Between April 9-15 you can receive \$1 off your fines for every unexpired

program to keep items out of landfills, earning a little money and helping those in need along the way. The collection bins in the main lobby gather items that can make an impact down the road.

The bright pink bin collects cell phones, tablets, ink cartridges, and more as part of the e-Recycling program. These items earn money for the Foundation, supporting programs and special projects at MPPL.

For nearly two years, the Library has also participated in the TerraCycle Personal Care and Beauty Product Brigade, collecting used packaging from health and beauty care items. These packaging items go through a process that recovers the original material they're made of so it can be used again.

Glasses donated to the Lions Recycle for Sight program are picked up by a volunteer, and cleaned and sorted by prescription strength. Then the glasses are sent to people who are not able to afford the expense of eyeglasses, and, in some cases, they are able to see clearly for the first time. The Lions Club also collects keys at MPPL as a separate fundraiser.




be retaken multiple times.




