Butterflies

The Library has recently added Butterflies by painter and papermaker Priscilla Robinson to its public art collection. Robinson was educated at the University of Arizona, Tucson, and Skidmore College in Saratoga Springs, New York. She has participated in more than 100 exhibitions worldwide.

"I am attracted to texture, materials, and luminosity," she says in her artist's statement. "I interconnect shapes and units to form a larger whole and combine fragments of thoughts that have interrelationships. The recurrent themes of wholeness and natural change thread through the work."

Inspired by the views from her studios in the Southwest, Robinson dries

cotton or flax fibers on forms, often combining them with fiberglass, and then paints them with acrylic pigments that bond with the paper to create strong surfaces. The Butterflies were originally based on "open books" as the concept.

"Handmade paper is combined with cast and fused glass," she writes. "Overbeaten fibers are used with natural coloration and watermarked with patterns. Other fibers are sometimes embossed and submerged in vibrant color. I like the contrast of the organic materials with the solidity of the glass."

Follow the yellow signs down

the ramp. Look for the multilingual welcome messages on the glass doors to the elevator and stairway to the lobby. Handicap parking spaces are located directly north of the lower lobby doors. Remember, when you are on the deck ramps, please drive slowly and watch for pedestrians. And, if you are walking on the ramps, please watch for cars around you.



Traveling Companions on Democracy Road

Gerould Kern, media executive and journalist, was the keynote speaker for the Mount Prospect Public Library's 75th Anniversary Celebration on Sunday, September 23. He was Senior Vice President and Editor of the *Chicago Tribune* for nearly eight years until his retirement in February 2016. He led the *Chicago Tribune* news staff through one of the most challenging eras in the paper's 171-year history.

His speech, "Traveling Companions on Democracy Road," addressed the role libraries and newspapers play in the digital age. Here are some key points from his talk.

- The rise of digital technology has dramatically impacted libraries, news media, schools, and other knowledge institutions that collect, curate, and disseminate information.
- © Digital technology also has profoundly changed the way people communicate and interact with each other. Our relationship with information—and our relationship to each other—in the digital age has changed.
- © Public libraries already play a vital role in helping us navigate these relationships. This role will only increase in importance because the pace of social and technological change will certainly keep accelerating.
- Libraries and newspapers adhere to different missions, perform different roles, and take different approaches.
- "I think of libraries and newspapers as our traveling companions on Democracy Road. They both strive to make their communities better places

to live through knowledge gained by the free flow of information and ideas. They both are community builders," he said.

- Today, our society faces new and more complex challenges regarding information literacy: That is, our ability to discern value in the deluge of information that rains down on us every day.
- The library is a vibrant village forum. The activities of the people and groups that meet here attest to its role as the Third Place between work and home.
- © Technology has freed us from the confines of physical space but also has enabled us to live disconnected from each other. In the digital age, we need the library as a place of real connection.

Gerry and his wife, Jewell, lived many years in Mount Prospect, and Jewell served on the Library Board from 1989-2001.


