

MIKE MULLIN

Tuesday, November 4, 7-9 p.m.



Mike Mullin's debut novel, *Ashfall*, the first in a series, imagines what would happen if the world was plunged into a cataclysmic natural disaster after a supervolcano eruption. *Ashfall* was named one of the top five young adult novels of 2011 by National Public Radio and a Best Teen Book of 2011 by *Kirkus Reviews*. Mullin will talk about the importance of determination, resilience, and

grit in achieving life goals, and he'll finish by trying to break a concrete block with his bare hand! Book signing immediately following the presentation. Bring your own books, or they will be available to purchase. (R)

Technical Services Award Honors Dedication to Consistency

When patrons search for a book, a DVD, or a compact disc in the Library's online catalog, they simply expect to find it—even if they don't know everything about that title or the author. However, in order for patrons to find what they are looking for, someone needs to correctly record the full name of the book, the actors in the movie, or the producer of the album; and, that information needs to be accurate and consistently listed the same way every time.

At MPPL, we have a whole department devoted to correctly cataloging and labeling our materials. In fact, this department does its job so well that its leader, Technical Services Head Rosemary Groenwald, was awarded the 2014 Illinois Library Association TBS, Inc. Technical Services Award. The award committee noted that Rosemary "advocates for service-oriented, patron-centered policies and practices."

MPPL staff has been at the forefront of making sure that all materials are accessible to patrons. Rosemary and two other Technical Services staff have been trained by the Library of Congress to create headings for persons and series titles that are added to the "national authority file." These headings are used by libraries' worldwide and ensure that all libraries catalog materials by the same author or in the same series in the same way.

"We try to create as many access points as possible in the records in the online catalog so patrons can discover the materials they're looking for," Rosemary said.

As an example, Rosemary points to the megaselling author Stephen

King. You may notice that he is listed in the online catalog as "King, Stephen (1947)." This, she explains, is to distinguish him from other authors that may have the same name. "While we have books by other Stephen Kings in our online catalog, all of the books by the bestselling Stephen King are linked under the correct heading for his name, which includes the year of his birth."

Detailed records also need to be developed for materials that are published as part of a series. It's important that all of these titles be uniformly cataloged using the same series name. It would be frustrating for patrons if, for example, some books were listed as part of the *Three Pines* series and others in the same series were listed as part of the *Inspector Gamache* series.

MAKER SPACES: Teens Create It Themselves at Open Sessions

If you've been feeling creative energy coming from the Library in the last few months, it must be teens doing the DIY thing at Open Creation Sessions. During the monthly events, teens stop by and sew, glue, Mod Podge®, fold, tape, upcycle, scrapbook, hack, and code, using their imaginations to do a variety of crafts and projects themselves.



The Library provides the space, the supplies, and instructional books. Library staff are always on the lookout for fun projects to demonstrate. Another hands-on hit was the RPG Maker Program®, where teens used software to develop their own video games.
