

### BARBARA RINELLA PORTRAYS Catherine THE GREAT

Have you ever wondered why there is only one woman in Russian history to be labeled "The Great"? Barbara Rinella will dramatize Robert Massie's fabulous biography Catherine the Great: Portrait of a Woman. Her performance will explain how a bewildered little German girl, initially ignored

because her mother wanted a son, evolves into the most powerful Empress in Russian history. Rinella will become Catherine as she tells the story of her painful marriage to dull and disappointing Peter, the necessity of producing an heir, and Catherine's creativity and brilliance as she charmed, used, and loved other men.

Rinella's performance is a fundraiser for the MPPL Foundation, which sponsors Library programming and special events. Tickets are \$18 and must be purchased in person at the Registration Desk by 5 p.m. Sunday, September 30. Payment must accompany registration. No tickets will be available at the door on the day of the performance.

# Are You Registered to Vote?

Eligible voters can register to vote at the Registration Desk whenever the Library is open.

Applicants must:

- ★ Be a citizen of the United States on the day of registration. If you became a citizen while living in the United States, you will need to know the date and the city where you became a citizen.
- ★ Be 18 years old by Tuesday, November 6, 2012.
- ★ Live at the registered address at least 30 days before Tuesday, November 6, 2012.
- ★ Display two pieces of identification. Identification must include one piece with a current address (neither need be a picture ID). Acceptable forms of ID





Unbroken: A World War II Story of Survival, Resilience, and Redemption by Laura Hillenbrand Wednesday, September 5, 1 p.m.


