We're joining CCS!

We are excited to announce we are joining the Cooperative Computer Services (CCS) catalog consortium in October 2024. A catalog consortium is a group of libraries that share the same catalog and can easily, quickly, and automatically share physical items with each other. There are 30 libraries in CCS; MPPL will be 31.

The community asked for this improvement during the 2022 Strategic Planning process, and it comes with significant benefits for Mount Prospect cardholders. As part of CCS, cardholders will have access to over 7 million items and will be able to place holds for those items at other libraries which will be automatically sent to the library in about 48 hours.

To handle the increased circulation of materials, we are updating a small portion of the Main Library with a target completion date of early fall 2024. The improvements will include expanded lobby space for more holds, more Library of Things, and more Lucky Day materials.

Costume Design with Ruth E. Carter: Interweaving Tradition and Imagination Wednesday, March 20, 7 p.m.

Best known for turning the Black Panther superhero into an African King, Ruth E. Carter made history as the first Black person to win the Costume Design category for *Black Panther*. Her work on *Black Panther: Wakanda Forever*, made her the first Black woman to win multiple Academy Awards in any category and the first costume designer to win for a film and its sequel. Carter is also known for costume design on period ensemble films. (V) (R)

Dr. Temple Grandin has long been at the forefront of research and activism for autism and neurodiversity. Grandin's research on animal behavior spearheaded a reform in the quality of life for agricultural animals. (V) (R)


