CCS and Renovation

When the library joins the Cooperative Computer Services (CCS) catalog consortium in October, MPPL cardholders will have access to over 7 million items at 30 other libraries.

To handle the increased circulation of materials, we'll be updating a small portion of the Main Library over the next few months. During this time, you'll see the following changes:

- A temporary wall installed across from the Patron Services desk.
- New Hold Shelves next to the temporary wall.
- Books will be returned to a bin at the Patron Services desk; the lobby automated book return and outdoor walk-up book return will not be available.
- It will take us more time to check in your returned items, so you will see them on your account for longer than usual, but remember, we are fine
- A new water fountain on the first floor with a bottle filler.
- The Library of Things and Lucky Day collections will be available in the main lobby hallway near the Youth department.


