CCS and Renovation

We are on track to migrate to the Cooperative Computer Services (CCS) catalog consortium in October. When completed, MPPL cardholders will enjoy the following benefits:



NOW AVAILABLE

Holds

- More Physical Materials. Joining CCS gives cardholders access to over 7 million items, which is about 14 times more items than we currently own.
- **Shorter Wait Times.** Borrowing items from another library is automated and faster, with a significantly shorter turnaround time.
- Ease of Use. The new catalog software is easier to use and more responsive.
- **Reduced Costs.** Sharing the catalog expenses with other libraries lowers our catalog costs.

To prepare for the CCS migration, here are some steps you can take:

- Stop by and update your personal information.
- Print or email any lists you have saved from the current catalog.

We're about halfway through the Main Library renovations we are doing to accommodate the increased circulation of materials. The new water fountain with a bottle filler has been installed; try it out next time you visit!

The following will still be in effect through the end of August:

- Books will be returned to a bin at the Patron Services desk; the lobby automated book return and outdoor walk-up book return will not be available.
- It will take us more time to check in your returned items, so you will see them on your account for longer than usual, but remember, we are fine free!
