MacStudio Quick Start Steps for VHS Digitizing with QuickTime Player






Step 1: Turn on the VCR and insert your tape.




Step 2: Open the QuickTime Player from the icon on the dock.


You'll see the words **QuickTime Player** appear on the bar in the upper left of the screen next to the Apple logo as seen in Step 3.



Step 3: Go up to the bar and, under the file tab, select **New Movie Recording**.



Step 4: Move the cursor over the Movie Recording window and the control window will appear. Select the down arrow next to the red button.



Step 5: Confirm that both USB Video and USB Audio are selected.



Step 6: Cue up your VHS tape and push play on the VCR. With your cursor, select the red button to begin recording. It will turn black when recording.



Step 7: To stop recording again move your cursor over the video display to reveal the control window. Select the black button to stop recording.



Step 8: Your recorded video file will immediately appear in place of the active recording. Seeing the play button on the control window will indicate that you are reviewing the recording.



Step 9: Under the **File** tab, select the **Save** option.



Step 10: On the resulting screen you may give your file a unique name and select where to save your file.

Select **Save** and you may close the window.
